SLO Makerspace FAQ

Q: What is a SLO Makerspace?

A: It is an open, collaborative machine/wood/electronics shop and craft center where one can build projects, teach and take classes, and network with others interested in making things. Q: Who can visit the Makerspace?

A: Anyone with a valid SLO County Library card will be provided free access to the SLO Makerspace for up to 15 hours each week. Kids 16 and under must be accompanied by an adult. Library cards must be presented for admission.

Q: When can I visit the Makerspace?

A: Library patrons will receive free access to the space Monday, Thursday, and Friday 4:00pm – 6:30pm, and Saturday and Sunday 11:00am – 3:00pm. If you would like to visit the space outside of those hours you would need to become a Makerspace Member.

Q: Where is the Makerspace?

A: The Makerspace is located in the retail center at the intersection of Higuera Ave and Madonna Rd, 81 Higuera Ave, Suites 160 + 180. The Makerspace is in the Northeast corner of the complex.

Q: What equipment does SLO Makerspace provide?

A: SLO Makerspace is equipped with a wide range of woodworking and metalworking tools, a pottery studio, electronics lab, 3D printer, and more. For a complete list of equipment please visit the <u>SLO Makerspace Facility</u> website. Note: Some advanced equipment require a certification class provided by the Makerspace at an additional expense.

Q: Are materials provided?

A: The Makerspace does not supply raw materials (i.e. wood, metal, clay, 3D printer filament), you will need to supply your own.
